4. Share footage of your pets participating in daily activities like eating, napping, playing etc.
5. Talk about your opinion on whether or not you feel humans have the same compassion for other humans as we do for animals (please expound as much as possible).
6. If you have an unusual passion for helping humans please tell us about it.

We do not expect you to provide everything listed above, please provide only the things that apply to you, and your experience. The footage will be edited together to make a cohesive story, similar to YouTube's Life in a Day documentary [found here](#). If you are not familiar with vlog footage, [this](#) is an example. Please don't worry about mistakes, adding music, or editing anything together, we will do all of that for you!

The following are a few tips for recording:

- Film in landscape mode instead of portrait (if you are using a cellphone).
- Get in the best light possible, it doesn't have to be perfect, but we want to see you
- Make sure you can be heard clearly while speaking
- Try not to hold back emotion, we want our viewers to connect to you and your story
- Be as comfortable and natural as possible, this is YOUR story, tell it however you feel most comfortable.
